

1. How did you first become interested in photography?

It kind of snuck up on me. I had an old point and shoot and enjoyed capturing images when I would go on road trips. I then wanted some reach, speed and more control so I moved up to a DSLR in 2004. Since then it's just been a progression of bodies and lenses trying to get that perfect image.

2. What or who inspires you?

It may sound a bit goofy but its life, the beautiful things in nature that surround us. Any time I see a hawk flying, a bee on a flower, or a spider spinning, it inspires me to capture it and share. I am not inspired by inanimate objects but I do know if I want to grow as a photographer I need to diversify. I refuse to take photographs of negative subjects, I would never have made it in life as a photojournalist!

3. What is your favorite subject to photograph and why?

Anything with eyes but mostly raptors. There is something so majestic, mystic, and graceful about these creatures. Whether it's a hawk, spider, deer, or a snake, watching them through a lens has given me an entire new appreciation for life. It's very relaxing being in their environment.

4. What would be your best piece of advice for others interested in photography?

Learn the basics about photography as well as know how to use the basic components of your gear. There is nothing more frustrating than being out on the road, seeing the perfect shot and then fumbling with your gear's settings. Practice, practice and practice.

Also shoot to satisfy yourself and not others.
