
many contributions to the Club. Don worked quietly and with great zeal and even after he moved to Barrie, he kept in touch with the club activities



Baiting Wildlife: I was reading Photo Life's on line newsletter they send me and I saw a short article on the Ethics of Baiting Wildlife by Dale Wilson which I felt really addressed the issue. It was a quote from a wild-life protection officer in Newfoundland. It read: "a fed animal is a dead animal. These animals become habituated, and once they lose their fear of humans unfortunately the interaction and contact rarely has a positive outcome for the animal". I know none of us would do what the article went on to relate however, before we feed or bait or lure animals all in the name of photography, let's consider the potential well-being of the animal. Once the animal loses its fear of humans the results can be fatal for the animal.

As the events are told in the article a mother had placed her young daughter on top of a picnic table to feed a juvenile wolf a few hot dogs while the mother snapped a few pictures. The young wolf apparently hadn't satisfied his appetite when the hot dogs were gone, and in his excitement, gave the young girl a nip on the hand. Notice the author wrote "nip". The author saw the young girls hand and although the skin was broken, no damage was done. Unfortunately the wolf had in fact bitten a human and it was put down. Although we should all questions the intelligence of the mother and be angered by her actions, it was the young wolf that paid the price.
